#### **Architectural Review Rules**

STOP! Don't paint that door or plant that hedge without talking to ARC! Any changes or additions to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval.

Major additions must be staked for visual reference to assess impact to adjoining properties.

Grove Homeowners must be in good standing to submit projects to ARC. All applicable HOA assessments be current and any late fees or fines are satisfied.

Scotter Hills and Ridgemoor residents need to be current with both their Grove townhouse and assessments and fees. Townhouse residents must apply to their board for approval PRIOR to submitting an ARC to The Grove. No applications will be considered without the town house board consent.

Most shutters are under a lifetime warranty, so do not repaint or replace! Warranty

information should be on the back of the shutters, including shipping requirements repair/replacement. Contact company verify instructions.

Are your doors or garage doors fading? If so, either refresh the existing color or submit an application to the Architectural Review Committee to change

paint color.

Annual letters of violation will be sent to those who have not taken care of these items, so take a proactive stance now!

Neighbor to Neighbor: Reaching Across the World

#### By Eileen Nyholm

I am a seven year resident of Krim Point and a retired Occupational Therapist who has started doing worldwide mission trips bringing humanitarian aid in the form of wheelchairs and mobility devices - two a year - since 2011. This work opened up to me after the death of my husband 5 years ago. Since then I have been to Crimea, Dominican Republic, Peru, Northern Ukraine, Cuba, Kazakhstan, Jordan...and in Jan. 2015, to Israel. I am interested in getting any used mobility devices people would like to donate and clear out of their homes or attics for collection and refurbishment and eventual use around the world. Items greatly needed are wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, canes, and adaptive equipment including splints and braces for arms or legs. We distribute these through Wheels for the World (www.joniandfriends.org).

Here's a glimpse into our last trip to Israel. The day before we left, there was a violent attack on a bus in TelAviv where we had been recently, and where part of our team had remained to provide an eyeglass clinic for Holocaust survivors. Yet, did anyone feel unsafe working in the West Bank/Palestinian Authority cities of Jericho or going to church in Bethlehem? Did anyone feel unsafe during or after the distribution, for five days of touring Israel from the streets of Jerusalem, Nazareth, Cana to the heights of the Arbel, Mount Carmel, Megiddo, entering tunnels under King Herod's old city, burial caves of Bet She'arim, or riding a boat on the Sea of Galilee? NO! Every day each of us live our lives by faith. What assurance do we have of our own safety driving a mile to the grocery store or the mall? No more than needed to fly 12 1/2 hours across the sea and encounter a different world. I firmly believe that being where God wants me to be, I am part of His schedule for my days on this earth - "my times are in His hands" and His words to us in each and every situation are "fear not". Life's

experiences living through the caregiving and death of my husband Jim and living alone has taught me most definitely that when I cast my fears on the Lord, I can always say He replaces fear with peace and joy.



#### Summer Lawn TLC

Lawns require tender loving care during the hot summer months. Beat the heat and drought with these proven strategies.

Raise the blade on your lawnmower to a minimum of 3 inches. This height promotes long, healthy roots, and chokes out weeds. Mowing too low damages the crown which stunts growth, whereas mowing too high can stress blades. Turf type also determines mower

height. If in doubt, consult a lawn care professional.

Water your lawn for a half an hour to 45 minutes once a week. The goal is to get an inch of water on the lawn. Place a can on the lawn to measure water depth. **Best** practices indicate it is more effective to water thoroughly once a week than 15 minutes 3 to 4 times per week. Additionally recommended that you water in the early morning versus mid-day or evening to prevent steam-cooking your turf or causing fungal infestations.

#### **Retail Business Safety**

One of the most important crime prevention strategies retail businesses can take is maximizing natural surveillance and visibility. Shoppers feel safer when they can see and be seen, and conversely, offenders are less comfortable when they can be detected (and potentially arrested). When shoppers feel safer, they are more apt to patronize a business, thereby increasing the profitability of that business. In a retail environment, steps to improve natural surveillance include:

- Keeping windows free of banners, displays and signage.
- Placing the cashier station close to the front entrance.
- Elevating the cashier station to enhance in-store visibility.
- Using mirrors and reflective surfaces to enhance internal visibility.
- Orienting gondolas and shelves to maximize visibility of store activities.
- Keeping gondolas and shelves below four-feet in height.
- Complimenting natural strategies by using electronic means to capture and record images.
- •Ensuring adequate internal and external nighttime illumination.
- •Retaining sightlines from surrounding roads and businesses through proper landscape placement and regular maintenance Remember that good security is good business. Clean, well-lit properties with ample visibility are more appealing to customers, and therefore more profitable for owners.

#### **Vacation Tips**

With summertime approaching, it is important to remember that as you prepare for your trip, you must also prepare your home. People spend a lot of time planning their trip and practically no time planning what is going to happen at their house in their absence. Below are some crime prevention tips to keep your home safe while you are gone. The key is to make your home look as if you never left.

- Keep shades and blinds in their normal positions.
- Stop mail and newspaper deliveries or ask a trusted neighbor/ friend to pick them up daily.
- Put timers on several household lights so they turn on and off at appropriate times.
- Arrange to have grass mowed while you are gone.
- Make sure all your door and window locks are in proper working order—and use them. Activate your home alarm if you have one.
- •Do things that suggest someone is home. Ask a trusted neighbor to park in your driveway. Leave a loud radio on (tuned to talk radio) to increase the illusion of occupancy.
- •If you are traveling by car, plan and map your route. Have routine car and tire maintenance performed before you leave.
- Leave copies of your passport, driver's license, credit cards and travelers checks with a trusted family member for replacement.
- •Contact the police department (748-1258) to request a vacation keep-check on your home.



#### Stop Summer Slide


