Demands on the HOA budget drive changes Assessments must be received by Associa by to the amount of homeowner assessments. Therefore, due to increases in maintenance and repair costs, The Grove's annual assessments will increase from \$400.00 to your payment to be mailed. Payments \$440.00 January 2017. Please watch your incoming mail for a statement from Associa in early December. If you have not received your statement by December 15, 2016 contact the community manager Tara Keeven by phone 804-270-1800 or email as dues to The Grove.

#### **Standards and Guidelines Violations**

HOA standards and guidelines are in place to ensure The Grove remains in good shape and attractive to those who live here. Homeowners who do not heed notification of violations to standards can face fines. The HOA sends out 3 letters to advise homeowners to correct the violation. If the homeowner does not correct the violation they will face a hearing before the Board of Directors, with possible charges of \$10 per day until the violation is corrected or up to 90 days. Areas of concern are, but not limited to, home and yard maintenance, signs, landscaping, vehicle parking, fencing, mailboxes and posts, sports equipment, and yard debris. #### Holiday Lights & Architectural Review Rules

According to HOA covenants, all holiday exterior décor and illumination must be removed no later than the 20<sup>th</sup> of January, 2017. Year-Round: Any changes or additions to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval. Major additions must be staked for visual reference to assess impact to adjoining properties. A homeowner must be in good standing to submit projects to ARC. All applicable HOA assessments be current and any late fees or fines are satisfied. Krim Point, Scotter Hills, and Ridgemoor residents need to be current with both their neighborhood HOA and Grove HOA assessments and fees. Townhouse residents must apply to their board for approval PRIOR to submitting to The Grove ARC. No applications will be considered without the town house board consent. The HOA has 30 days to review submissions to ARC. For complete details see www.thegrovehoa.com Covenants & Bylaws tab.

### Yard Waste in Common Areas

Keep The Grove beautiful! If your property adjoins a common area you cannot dispose of leaves and grass clippings, etc. in these areas. This also applies to

landscapers working on your vard.

Most local refuse collection companies will remove your yard debris if you place it by the curb. Contact the company who handles your weekly trash removal for details.

#### Winter Damage to Trees

Before winter sets in with ice and snow, please make sure that all dead trees are removed from your property. Please also ensure to have trimmed any limbs that are dead or overhanging your home. The cold and icy conditions of winter can weaken trees and cause them to snap and drop where you don't want them, so prevent potential damage right now! Please get prior approval from the Architectural Review Committee before removing trees, even those dead or rotting. Per the covenants, tree removal requires ARC permission. 

Make your lists and check them 1. **twice!** Determine your budget, and write down what you'll spend for each item. Decide ahead of time where to purchase everything. ## DO NOT FEED THE GEESE/ WILDLIFE

# 4VAC15-40-286. Unauthorized feeding of wildlife.

It shall be unlawful for any person as defined in § 1-230 of the Code of Virginia to place, distribute, or allow the placement of food, minerals, carrion, trash, or similar substances when it attracts any species of wildlife in such numbers or circumstances to cause property damage, endanger any person or wildlife, or create a public health concern. Upon notification by department personnel, any such person shall be in violation of this section if the placing,

distribution, or presence of such food, minerals, carrion, trash, or similar substances continues. This section shall not be construed to restrict bona fide agronomic plantings (including wildlife food plots), bona fide distribution of food to livestock, or wildlife management activities conducted or authorized by the department or U.S. government agencies with wildlife management responsibilities.
