Home from Iraq: The Grove Community thanks Lt. Col. Joseph

When Lt. Col. Joseph McClain returned to his home from Iraq, he never imagined the community support he would witness. “He was very moved and surprised by how many people showed their support. As I drove him around the community he was counting how many homes displayed yellow ribbons. He said ‘he couldn’t believe that it was all for him.’ We must have driven around at least 6 times, it was awesome.” his wife Tina says.

Dealing with Joe leaving for Iraq was difficult for Tina, “The first week I watched the news constantly and was driving myself crazy, so I stopped watching and got busy,” says Tina. And busying herself she did; while Joe was over in Iraq, Tina attended graduate school full time at VCU, worked part time at VCU hospital, took care of their two children, 9 year old, Megan, and 2 year old, Joseph II, and moved their family from Hawkins Wood to Coalbrook.

Joe joined the Army when he was 17 and spent the next 19 years training to become a cardiothoracic, trauma and general surgeon. Joe left for Iraq in October 2005 for a six-month rotation. He was stationed in Baghdad at Ibn Sina Hospital with the 10th Combat Support, which is the country’s busiest trauma center.

The seven years he spent working at Brooke Army Medical Center, Fort Sam Houston, Texas, in trauma surgery and the last three years working as a cardiac surgeon and professor at McGuire VA Hospital and Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, (continued p. 4)



did not prepare him, as Joe was not accustomed to seeing so many of his patients die.

Joe expected to treat more Americans, but in fact, 75 percent of the patients at the hospital were Iraqi, “which means the Iraqi army is standing up and fighting back.” However, the stream of U.S. troops and their injuries moved him unexpectedly. “I didn’t think it would emotionally drain me because I’ve been doing this for so long,” said Joe.

In February while Joe was in Baghdad, Tina’s cousin, Ted Schwinn, was in the Red Zone and was injured badly. When Tina finally got in contact with Joe and asked him to track down Ted, they learned that Ted was actually Joe’s patient. Prior to their fateful meeting, the two men had never met in person. Joe expedited Ted’s return back to Washington DC, where he has made a remarkable recovery. Ted and his family are planning to visit the McClain’s this summer. “Sometimes, things happen for a reason. It was good that Joe was there for a family member in need – both professionally and personally.” Said Tina

“Overall, the entire experience was good,” Tina says. “It brought our family closer together and Joe really values his experience in Iraq, especially now that it is finally behind us.”

Joe and Tina want to thank the entire Grove community for the outpouring of support and kindness shown to them while Joe was in Iraq and when he returned. “Our neighbors were really there for us.”

He was victim of a very rare yet potentially deadly side effect to a statin cholesterol lowering drug called Crestor. Some 20 months later, he has recovered nearly 100%.

Fortunately, his mom Joyce Johnson of Krim Point lived just a short distance away. She came every morning and stayed with him and helped Mike's wife Kathy get son Carter off to daycare and then care for Mike throughout the day.

But, how do you thank a mom who came out of retirement as a nurse, to be a 24 hour nurse and mom all over again? He entered her into Midlothianexchange.com's BEST OF MOM's contest. They won first place! Joyce now gets to spend a day at the spa courtesy of Spa Epidauros.

"It's the least I could do," said Mike. "How do you thank someone who gives constantly to others and won't allow you to do anything for her?"

An open letter to my mom, Joyce Johnson of Midlothian, after I fell critically ill at age 35.

There were many nights when I was genuinely scared that I wouldn't wake up, but morning always came and you were right there to make sure I was ok. Thanks for the wonderful Isaiah 40:30-31 verse which I have kept by my side ever since. It was you and God that got me through all this mess.

Thanks for the countless hours you spent taking care of me, my family, and our house. Thanks for the store runs, the meals, and the warming of my heating pads, just to name a few things.

Though I don't show it often, I love you very much and am very thankful you are my mom. At this stage of life, I should be taking care of you, not the other way around.

You have been so giving to me and everyone all your life. It seems you never spend a nickel on yourself and give so much of your time to everyone else.



House Tips: Benefits of Ventilation Systems

Ventilation in your house is ineffective during Virginia's hot, humid months, where temperatures don't change much during day and night. However, **attic ventilation** can help in this situation.

Ventilating your attic can greatly reduce the amount of accumulated heat in your attic, which can easily reach 150 degrees in the summer months. Eventually, that heat works its way in to the main part of your home, causing your air conditioning unit to run more. Ventilated attics are about 30 degrees cooler than unventilated attics.* Properly sized and placed louvers and roof vents help prevent moisture buildup, which can cause mildew and overheating in your attic. In addition roof vents can extend the life of your roof by reducing heat damage.
