## Beautification Underway!

Landscaping Initiatives for  
Fall 2006 – and Spring 2007

Nature's Way Landscaping will begin working on rehabilitation of the turf areas throughout the common areas of The Grove. They will be doing their normal aerating, seeding, and fertilizing of the property. They will also begin adding topsoil to bare areas. These areas will be seeded and top dressed to facilitate proper germination. Nature's Way is also putting a landscape design together for the dam area to give a better curb appeal. The main goal of the above program is to improve the grass areas and to address solutions for the other open common areas. In addition, the tree removal process by Bubba's Tree Service is just about complete with over 100 dead trees and stumps being removed. In addition, replanting of new trees will continue.

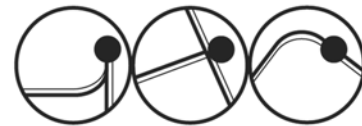

# Aerate, Seed, Fertilize.....

The hot dry summer is finally over and it is time to think about some lawn maintenance. September is the month to AERATE, SEED, FERTILIZE, AND LIME our yards. The summer was hard on our lawns and most of us have BROWN PATCH. This fungus condition can cause weeds to take over places where grass did live.

In October, we need to fertilize our lawn again. Start winterizing your lawn and flower beds.

In November, toward the end of the month we need to do our last fertilization. This is called the S.O.N. program. (Sept., Oct., and Nov.)

If you have any questions or have a problem with plants or your lawn, call the Chesterfield Extension Office at 751-4401. I also would like to recommend the Grass Roots Program to each of you next year. It is a lawn program offered through the Extension Office. Call them and get on the list for next year (April).

## Village of Midlothian Development Update:

Zoning has been approved for Centex to develop a residential Colonial Style, Neo Traditional subdivision to be located on the far end of the big pond across from The Grove. This community will feature 160 units, with detached garages located in the back of the homes – much like you see in The Fan. There will be small parks located throughout the community.

Read Goode, who developed the center with the new Wendy's, is developing another site across Midlothian Turnpike called Jefferson Green Office Park, with three office buildings. Goode broke ground this month.

The Edens and Avant project between Le Gordon Drive and Charter Colony Parkway held a public hearing at the Midlothian High School. Detailed plans were presented. The Army Corp. of Engineers has to do a study of the wetlands. If the site is approved, the developer would have to relocate the wetlands elsewhere. Their choice is in two other counties - which doesn't seem to improve the land water table in that Midlothian area. When the K-Mart was built (where the new Kroger will be located), many of the wells of the residents off Le Gordon had their wells go dry. Many of them were at the meeting to voice their concerns. The Midlothian Planning Commissioner, Dan Gecker, did not seem to be in favor of the project.

Representatives of The First Citizen's Bank presented detailed plans to the Village Coalition. The location is at the intersection of Woolridge Road and Midlothian Turnpike where the Avis Car Rental used to be. The bank will sit diagonally on the lot - thus facing the corner. The drive in units will be to the back of the building which will be of classical design constructed of red brick. Curb breaks into the Bank will be Eastbound on Midlothian Turnpike and Southbound on Woolridge Rd. It will be surrounded by a Black picket fence similar to the Wachovia one. Since this bank will be located on the entrance to the The Village of Midlothian, extensive landscaping planned for the property.

## Neighborhood Watch Tip---Keeping Your Home Safe

In these days and times, it is important to take every precaution in keeping our homes safe from harm. Burglaries are happening more often at residences and during the daytime hours.

Below are some ideas for you to consider in keeping our homes safe from these intruders:

- If you have recently moved into your new home, change the locks. Copies of your house key could be floating around anywhere.
- Install deadbolts on all ground level doors.
- Install an alarm if you do not already have one.
- Trim the shrubbery down in front of the house no taller than the windows.
- Keep your doors and windows locked at all times.
- If you go on vacation, leave your key with a close friend, or family member so they can keep watch over your house. You can also tell the Neighborhood Watch Street Leader to keep an eye out if you have one in your neighborhood. Try leaving at least one light on while you're away so it looks like you are there.
- Don't give repairmen a key, and don't give people fixing your car your whole set of keys. Your house keys can be easily duplicated and your address can usually be obtained from your license plate number.
- Don't let strangers into your home. Deliverymen and people on legitimate business can always show you their ID.
- Report broken streetlights. Well-lit areas mean less hiding places for burglars.
- Report any strangers you notice loitering in your neighborhood.
