New residents will be accommodated as quickly as possible. Current residents who have missed scheduled validation dates will have their passes validated when the committee can accommodate them; No one will be given access to the pool without a 2012 validation punch. Lifeguards cannot validate your cards.

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
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PLEASE DO NOT BRING ANY GLASS TO THE POOL

Recently several community pools in the metro Richmond area were forced to temporarily shut down due to broken glass in the pools. Douglas Aquatics had to completely drain and thoroughly clean pool surfaces. Although draining and refill process costs thousands of dollars, the safety of our neighbors is of utmost importance. At one pool, swim team members were cut by the glass.

Glass is not allowed at The Grove Pool so please do not bring any type of glass containers into or near the pool. Tossing glass into refuse bins does not guarantee its proper disposal. If you notice anyone with glass, inform the lifeguard manager on duty or tell the offender to place the glass into a plastic container and remove it from the pool area.

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

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Make an Emergency Supply Kit

Recent derecho storms remind us we should be ready for emergencies

Hurricane season is here. And nearly everyone in Virginia recently experienced the historic derecho severe storms and extended power outages. Do you have an emergency supply kit?

Every family needs supplies on hand for these situations. Start your emergency kit with these essential items:

Three days' of food that won't spoil, such as canned goods and packaged foods Three days' of water, one gallon per person per day A hand crank and/or battery-powered radio and extra batteries A written family emergency plan

Once you gather these basics, put them in waterproof containers that you can carry or roll in case you need to leave your home quickly. Old suitcases or backpacks also can hold supplies.

Other items are useful in an emergency supply kit, such as flashlights with extra batteries (not candles), a first aid kit, a list of prescriptions and doctors and a supply of medications, food and water for your pets, and special items for babies, disabled or older family members.

Think that's too much to do? At least get started with the essential items, and then add to your kit. For a fill-in or downloadable family emergency plan worksheet, go to www.ReadyVirginia.gov and click on "Make a Plan."

Emergency preparedness is everyone's responsibility. Everyone should be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least the first 72 hours, and everyone should have a family emergency plan.

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Top 10 Tips to Stay Cool, Save Money Easy and inexpensive solutions for business or home from energysavers,gov

Maintain air filters and HVAC equipment. Well-maintained equipment runs more efficiently, so replace or clean filters as needed and service air conditioner unit annually.

Set your thermostat as high as is comfortable. The smaller the difference between the indoor and outdoor temperatures, the lower your overall cooling bill will be. Running the AC at 78°F instead of 72°F can save 6%-18% on your cooling bill.

Draw your drapes. Keep your blinds, shades and curtains closed on south and west-facing windows during the day to block the heat of direct sunlight.

Stop cool air from escaping. Cool air can go right out the window. Add weatherstripping on doors and windows and caulk the cracks to prevent leakage.

Properly insulate your attic. Install modern insulation to lower heating and cooling costs. On warm days, attic temperatures can get up to 140°F. In high cooling climates, a radiant barrier installed under the roof deck and/or a continuous ridge and soffit vent can effectively lower attic temperatures.

Plant trees or shrubs for shade. A good landscaping plan reduces costs. Properly placed trees around the house can save between \$100 and \$250 annually.

Install ceiling fans. A ceiling fan can make a room feel 6 or 7 degrees cooler while using less energy than a 100-watt light bulb. Run fans only when people are in the room.

Go oven-less at meal time. To prepare small meals, use the microwave, toaster or a counter-top grill, all of which use less energy than a full-sized oven.

Unplug electronics and appliances when not in use. Use multiple-outlet strips so you can turn everything off with one flip of a switch. Leaving a computer on all day can cost about 21 cents per day, or about \$75 per year.

Replace incandescent bulbs with compact fluorescent bulbs (CFLs). Lighting makes up about 10% of home energy costs, and CFLs can save up to 75% of that energy. They also last longer, saving money on replacements.
