Architectural Review Rules

Any changes or additions to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval. Major additions must be staked for visual reference to assess impact to adjoining properties. A homeowner must be in good standing to submit projects to ARC. All applicable HOA assessments be current and any late fees or fines are satisfied. Scotter Hills and Ridgemoor residents need to be current with both their townhouse and Grove HOA assessments and fees. Townhouse residents must apply to their board for approval PRIOR to submitting an ARC to The Grove. No applications will be considered without the town house board consent. Planting and Removal of Trees Requires ARC Approval!

ARTICLE VII - ENVIRONMENTAL COVENANTS: In order to protect the natural beauty of the vegetation, topography or other natural features within the Subdivision, the following environmental controls are hereby established.

7.01. Trees. To the extent reasonably practical, the clearing of mature trees on Lots shall be limited to those areas required to accommodate the residence to be constructed thereon and its normal and customary accessories, open front yard areas and those areas required to permit utility services and driveways. No trees measuring six (6) inches in diameter at a point two (2) feet above ground level which are located more than twenty (20) feet away from the residence or structure constructed on the Lot, shall be removed without the prior written approval of the Architectural Control Committee.

Lime was applied in June to the lawns in Scotter Hills and Ridgemoor. A second application will be placed in late August. Additional watering will be needed throughout the summer. It is the responsibility of the owner/occupant to ensure the irrigation is working properly and to water your lawns. The Board of Directors will be reviewing the community in late summer to determine if yards need to be re-established. If your lawn is one that requires that process due to lack of water the homeowner will be assessed for the cost of this repair. Please maintain the beauty and aesthetics of the community by properly watering and maintaining your yard. Curb appeal is a major factor in maintaining property values.



Note: "Effective July 1, 2006, the Code of Virginia, Section 32.1-46, requires a booster shot of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, accellular pertussis) is required for all children entering the 6th grade, if at least 5 years have passed since the last dose of tetanus-containing vaccine. Written proof (month-day-year) of vaccination with Tdap or a tetanus-containing vaccine (TT, Td, DTaP, DT) must be provided to your child's middle school. 6th grade students who do not provide adequate documentation will not be permitted to start school on Tuesday,

DO NOT FEED THE GEESE/WILDLIFE

4VAC15-40-286. Unauthorized feeding of wildlife.

It shall be unlawful for any person as defined in § 1-230 of the Code of Virginia to place, distribute, or allow the placement of food, minerals, carrion, trash, or similar substances when it attracts any species of wildlife in such numbers or circumstances to cause property damage, endanger any person or wildlife, or create a public health concern. Upon notification by department personnel, any such person shall be in violation of this section if the placing, distribution, or presence of such food, minerals, carrion, trash, or similar substances continues. This section shall not be construed to restrict bona fide agronomic plantings (including wildlife food plots), bona fide distribution of food to livestock, or wildlife management activities conducted or authorized by the department or U.S. government agencies with wildlife management responsibilities.

Hurricane Arthur, a Category 2 storm, dealt Virginia a glancing blow during the July 4 weekend. We've got a long way to go during this hurricane season – what steps should you take now to protect your family and property?

• Talk to an insurance agent about flood insurance. Most homeowner's insurance policies do not cover flooding. Just one inch of water in a mid-size home or office can mean as much as \$20,000 in cleanup and repairs! Remember:

There is usually a 30-day waiting period before coverage begins.

Renters also can buy flood insurance, to cover personal belongings or business inventory.

Download the free Ready Virginia app for iPhone® and Android™ devices. Use the app to prepare for disasters and to stay
informed during emergencies. Features include:

Push notifications of weather warnings for your location issued by the National Weather Service

A customizable emergency plan that can be easily shared with family and friends

A checklist for gathering emergency supplies

The latest disaster news on widespread emergencies from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management

• Build an emergency kit. Start with three days' water and three days' food that doesn't need electricity or refrigeration. Then add:

A battery-powered and/or hand-crank radio with a weather band and extra batteries to hear information from local officials

Flashlights and extra batteries


First aid kit and extra supply of medications

Special items for babies, older family members and pets
