Fee Charge Increase for LATE Pool Pass Validation

The HOA Board of Directors voted at the January 2013 meeting to charge \$5 per family for pool passes that are requested to be validated <u>AFTER</u> the completion of pool pass validation dates. This applies only to current residents who do not attend any of the scheduled nights during the month of May; new residents will continue to be accommodated after their closing.

Ample opportunities are made for pool pass validation over the course of several weeks and the requests to accommodate residents who do not attend these dates are numerous and significantly inconvenient for the volunteers who process these requests.

Please note if you can not attend one of the scheduled dates you may have your passes validated by a neighbor as long as your HOA dues are current.

Fishing Hooks May Cause Wiring Shorts

Before fishing in our catch and release pond, please make sure that your hooks are not oversized and that they are secured to your lines.

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Winter Weather Safety and Erosion Warnings

During the last snow storm kids were observed sledding on the dam near the pond. Please ask your kids NOT to sled in this area. Damage to new landscaping and plantings by sledders is an expense that places additional burden on the Association.

Warning: Local iced-over ponds, like the Grove Pond, can become unsafe because they do not freeze solid or stay cold enough for sufficient safe ice to form. In addition the Grove Pond is a storm water retention pond susceptible to heavy flows. Any ice forming on the pond can be significantly WEAKENED by SMALL amounts of rain, sleet, or snow. Runoff can contain salts and sand from road treatment that will also weaken the ice. Keep your kids safe and warn them of the dangers of attempting to walk on ice on the pond.



Environmental Woes Impact The Grove

Please be aware of where your children are playing. The costs associated with clean up of debris carried to the creeks and the associated dangers to children playing there unsupervised are significant. The area most impacted recently is between Coalbrook Dr. and Biggin Pond Ct. Children are building dams upstream behind Coalbrook.

When kids disturb vegetation in the common area wetlands, it's no longer "child's play."

Repercussions include damage to federally protected areas and levying environmental fines to the HOA.

Other threats to the environment: disturbing creek beds and rip rap. Digging huge holes alongside newly repaired walking baths undermine paths integrity, which create safety hazards for walkers and erosion issues.

All of these increase repair costs to the HOA and spoil the beauty of our neighborhood.

Medication Take-Back

In partnership with SAFE (Substance Abuse Free Environment), the Chesterfield County Police Department will host the first Medication Take-Back of the year. The event will be held at the Chesterfield County Police Clover Hill Support Facility, located at 2730 Hicks Road, N. Chesterfield, VA 23235, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday, Feb 9.



Please use this opportunity to turn in your unused or expired

prescriptions, over-the-counter and veterinary medications for safe disposal (leave medications in their original containers.) Last year, a total of 845 residents turned in 2,943 pounds of unused or expired medication for safe disposal.

"Neighbors Helping Neighbors" Through C.E.R.T.

CERT stands for Community Emergency Response Team. Program training provides basic emergency skills needed immediately following a major disaster, when emergency services may not be available and when residents may have to rely on each other for life-saving and life-sustaining needs. CERT volunteers learn how to help family and neighbors in emergency situations – whether caused by terrorism, technological disasters or severe weather. Instruction centers on disaster preparedness and response, fire safety, first aid, search and rescue techniques, and terrorism preparedness. Courses are **FREE** and open to those age 18 and up. Additional training, such as CPR/AED, is offered upon completion of the Basic CERT Class, for a minimal fee.

CERT is taught year round. The next class begins April 30 and ends May 22, meeting two mornings for four weeks from 8:30 a.m. until Noon. Class is held at the Eanes-Pittman Public Safety Training Center, 6610 Public Safety Way, Chesterfield, VA 23832.

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
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Sweetheart 8K Race Traffic Alert

Heart disease kills more women than any other causes of death combined. According to the American Heart Association's website, the death rate is one in three women each year, or one woman per minute.


To bring visibility and promote heart disease awareness among women, the AHA holds a "Wear Red" Day annually on the first Friday in February, in addition to other events throughout the year.
