décor no later than the 20th of January, 2015.

YEAR-ROUND: Any changes or additions to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval. You must be a homeowner in good standing (HOA assessments up to date). Major additions must be staked for visual reference to assess impact to adjoining properties. For complete details see thegrovehoa.com Covenants & Bylaws tab.

Our Annual Scotter Hills/Ridgemoor Homeowners Meeting has been changed to Wednesday, November 5th.

Maintenance Reminders (Things We Tend to Forget!). Dryer vents need to be cleaned periodically to prevent fire danger. You are urged to have a metal exhaust pipe coming from your dryer to reduce fire danger. Your HVAC unit needs to be kept free of grass and weeds and should be hosed clean periodically for increased efficiency. Be sure to winterize your outside water bibbs by turning off the cutoff and draining the lines by opening the faucet. It is recommended to leave the faucet open slightly during the winter season.

Leash Your Dog - It's the Law!

It is a county ordinance that dogs MUST be leased at all times. They may not be loose even when walking at your side. This is a safety issue for runners/ walkers/children, etc. Even if your dog has a gentle temperament, those approaching an unleashed dog may have concerns that the dog will bite or attack them. Folks walking in the neighborhood have the right to protect themselves with deterrents such as pepper spray if threatened by a dog not under the owner's control. It's the law: LEASH YOUR DOG AT ALL TIMES, EVEN FOR SHORT WALKS.

Pet Waste

Please clean up after your pet in the common areas. Use the pet waste disposal stations conveniently located along the walking paths. Also, do not allow your pet to relieve themselves in the playground or any other high traffic area. Pet waste has been found around slides.

Residential Safety (continued)

It has been reported in the media and on The Grove Residents Facebook, that vandalism has been mainly occurring at houses not currently occupied by owners (vacant homes, model homes, and homes under construction). At a house in Coalbrook, the crawl space had been broken into and the copper piping was stolen. Chesterfield County Police recommend the following to enhance exterior security:

"Keep garage/shed windows and doors closed and locked at all times — even when you are home.


Alarm your garage/shed. Whether added to an existing system or secured via a freestanding wireless system, a motion activated alarm is an excellent deterrence as well as detection. Be sure to post signs and/or decals to indicate that a security system is in place. If a security system is not affordable, post alarm decals and signs anyway to deter offenders.

Install solid panel, metal-clad, exterior pedestrian doors. Secure the overhead garage door with C-clamps in the door tracks when away for an extended period.

Install motion-activated flood lights to detect nighttime activities and enhance the impression that a person's presence has been detected. Place lights out of easy reach, if possible. Prune shrubs and trees around detached buildings to provide visibility and prevent concealment.

Install lock on crawl space door."






