Fireworks Illegal Per County

There is no official fireworks display in The Grove due to County restrictions. Discharging fireworks in the subdivision without a permit is against Chesterfield County law and therefore illegal. According to Chesterfield's government website, the county fire prevention code "prohibits the sale, possession, and use of

fireworks by anyone other than a licensed and permitted fireworks professional." You must apply for this permit 60 days in advance of the display, and include proof of \$1,000,000.00 liability insurance, and a pyrotechnician certification, in addition to other requirements. Any unauthorized fireworks use is punishable by law.

Time To Glow, Grovers!

Now that the weather is getting warmer, it's time to roll up your sleeves and take care of all those exterior projects around the house and property. First check your mailbox. Is it faded? Does your post have rot and/or chipped paint? With HOA inspections on the horizon, get that taken care of before violation notices are sent. See page 4 for details on mailbox refurbishment. Check if your driveway needs to be repaired or sealed. Inspect your lawn for weeds and keep it properly mowed. Weed and

trim your foundation beds. Make sure your irrigation system is working correctly. Examine your pedestrian and garage doors for fading and chipped paint. Check your shutters. Most shutters are under a lifetime warranty, so check the information on the back, which should include shipping requirements for repair/replacement. Contact the company to verify instructions. Is the vinyl siding moldy or just in need of a good power washing? Let's keep this neighborhood great, for the good of all!

Architectural Review Rules

Before installing those outdoor patios or extending your deck, any changes or additions to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval. Major additions must be staked for visual reference to assess impact to adjoining properties. A homeowner must be in good standing to submit projects to ARC. All applicable HOA assessments be current and any late fees or fines are satisfied. Krim Point, Scotter Hills, and Ridgemoor residents need to be current with both their neighborhood HOA and Grove HOA assessments and fees. Townhouse residents must apply to their board for approval PRIOR to submitting to The Grove ARC. No applications will be considered without the town house board consent. *The HOA has 30 days to review submissions to ARC.* For complete details see www.thegrovehoa.com Covenants & Bylaws tab.

Homeowners whose property backs up to the walking paths should periodically check their shrubbery and trees for overhanging branches inhibiting people's progress on the paths.

2018 Pool Pass Validation Dates

Location: The Clubhouse

Bring your pool passes to get them validated on one of the following dates. **All NEW residents need to bring a registration form and waiver form to complete validation.** You can download those ahead of time at thegrovehoa.com. **CURRENT residents do not need to complete the forms, just bring your pool passes.** The HOA will continue to use stickers to update the passes for 2018 and beyond. **Please note if you cannot attend one of the scheduled dates you may have your passes validated by a neighbor as long as your HOA dues are current.** There is a \$5 charge per family for pool passes that are requested to be validated **AFTER** the completion of pool pass validation dates. This applies only to current residents who do not attend any of the scheduled times during the month of May; new residents will continue to be accommodated after their closing. If you are a current resident who missed the validation dates or a new resident who needs a pool pass, please contact our Pool Committee Chair Anne Biedrycki at afbiedrycki@gmail.com to schedule an appointment. **Volunteers are needed to validate pool passes, as well as join the pool committee.** To help out please email Anne Biedrycki.

Mailbox Improvement

Freshen up your home's exterior starting with your mailbox! If the post and wooden paper box is in good condition, apply a new coat of paint, but if deteriorated, replace it. Approved dark hunter green boxes (item #E1600G00) can be purchased

in-store at Pleasants Hardware/Midlothian Station Shopping Center, or ordered online (not in stores) at www.homedepot.com. If your mailbox numbers need replacement visit Pleasant Hardware/Midlothian. The mailbox numbers as seen in the photo may be purchased only at Pleasants. Mailbox can be repainted using dark hunter green matte spray paint.

Many home repair companies offer mailbox refurbishing services, but make sure they adhere to bylaw standards. Grove resident John Romano provides repairs and replacements to mailboxes and posts (see page 11).

Street Light & Road Repair

The Grove does not maintain its own streets or street lights. If a bulb is out or a light is not functioning properly (blinking, etc.), please call Chesterfield County 804-751-4178. (Please have the number from the light and address or cross streets) If Chesterfield says it is in the system, you can then call Dominion at 888-667-3000 to report it and all subsequent

issues.

If it is a street sign issue, contact: BelcherJ@Chesterfield.gov.

If it is a road issue, go to: <https://my.vdot.virginia.gov>. Use this link to report road repairs directly to VDOT. If you create an account, they will email you with updates on the progress of your request.

Townsq

TownSq is a website developed by Associa for use in the neighborhoods they manage, and is now available to The Grove. TownSq does not replace our current website thegrovehoa.com, but will be useful for paying HOA assessments online and participating in chat forums. You will continue to book events at the Clubhouse and find HOA documents and forms (By Laws & Covenants, ARC applications, pool applications, etc.) via thegrovehoa.com. To access

Townsq, log onto www.townsq.io (using any browser except Internet Explorer) OR download the FREE mobile app (search for "TownSq") with your account number and Community zip code. Your account number is found in the middle of your assessment bill from Associa/Community Group. You will need this to register, then you can log in.

As soon as features available to us in Townsq are verified, the neighborhood will be notified.

Got a milestone birthday or anniversary this year? If you are looking for a reasonably priced venue to hold your special celebration, hold it at The Grove Clubhouse! Rates are only \$75 for 3 hours, or \$125 for 6 hours and only \$10 for any additional hour(s). A \$75 refundable deposit is required at time of booking.

Rental of the Clubhouse includes the following inventory but does NOT include pool usage:

8 7' Folding Tables, 3 Folding Bar Height Tables, 50 Folding Chairs, TV with access to 15 local channels via a digital converter box, A Full service kitchen complete with stove, oven, microwave and refrigerator, and Walkout patio use and picnic tables.

You must be a Grove resident in good standing to book the Clubhouse. This means you must be current with HOA assessments and any other fees due to the HOA.

Go to the Clubhouse tab on thegrovehoa.com, click on the "Clubhouse Pricing and Reservations" link, then select

the "Reserve Now" link. Complete the required information and submit the form, which will go to our Clubhouse Coordinators, Anne Biedrycki & Leslie Elliott. The Clubhouse Coordinator position is shared as follows: Anne Biedrycki handles any inquiries, events or booking requests in even months and Leslie Elliott handles any inquiries, events or booking requests in odd numbered months. Fire Safety

The Grove is a non-leaf burning neighborhood. Please do not burn your trash, debris, or anything else in your yard. Also please observe the following on fire pits/chimineas:

Recreational and Warming fires are allowed without a permit if the fuel is clean wood **ONLY** and shall be at least 25 feet from any structure or combustible material and be no larger than 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height. Do not place a fire pit/chimineas on your deck or less than 25 feet from your house.

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Tips To Plant Flowers

- 1) Above all, follow packet instructions. Pick the right spot for each flower. Full sun is 6 or more hours of direct sun; partial sun is 6 or less; partial shade is about 4 hours, shade depends on depth (little to no sunlight).
- 2) Soil should be loose, well drained, and plenty of organic material.
- 3) Depth to plant depends on its type. Some require shallow planting to allow roots & rhizomes to spread.
- 4) Water according to the plants needs and take rainfall into account.
- 5) Groom: feel free to pick plants for bouquets, and remove dead blooms and leaves.

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Argentinean Grilled Steak with Salsa Criolla



Makes: 4 Servings

Prep time: 25 minutes

Tonight, try a recipe from South America! Enjoy these Argentinean-style steaks with a homemade Criolla Sauce, packed with flavor.

Ingredients

For the sauce:

- 1** large, ripe tomato (cored, seeded, and finely chopped, about 1/2 cup)
- 1/4** small red onion (finely chopped, about 1/4 cup)
- 2 tablespoons** fresh parsley (finely chopped)
- 2 teaspoons** extra virgin olive oil
- 2 teaspoons** red wine vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon** minced garlic
- 1/4 teaspoon** oregano leaf
- 1/8 teaspoon** low-sodium adobo seasoning
- 1/8 teaspoon** crushed red pepper

For the steak:

- 1 pound** skirt steak
- 1/8 teaspoon** low-sodium adobo seasoning

Directions

For the sauce:

In a small bowl, mix together tomato, onions, parsley, olive oil, vinegar, garlic, oregano, low-sodium adobo seasoning and crushed red pepper. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour or up until 48 hours.

For the steak:

1. Heat grill to medium-high heat. Sprinkle steak on both sides with low-sodium adobo seasoning. Place steak on hot, greased grill grates.
 2. Cook, flipping once, until steak is well browned on both sides and cooked to 145 °F (about 6 minutes for medium-rare).
 3. Let rest for 5 minutes. Thinly slice steak.
- Divide steak evenly among serving plates. Top with reserved Salsa Criolla

Bike Safety

As the seasons change, more and more people will be getting their bikes out of storage and back on the road. Biking is a great way to enjoy the outdoors and get some exercise, but cyclists will be sharing the road with cars, trucks, buses, and other motor vehicles. The bike will be no match for a car if they should happen to meet. To make sure you're as safe as you can be while riding, here are a few things to keep in mind:

- Safety gear: Make sure you have a properly fitted helmet and pads to minimize injuries.
- Remember that the rules of the road apply to bikes as well as motor vehicles. Traffic signals, signs, and direction of travel are the same for everyone sharing the road. Bikes and their riders are hard to see, and disobeying the established rules for the road can spell disaster.
- Keep to the right as far as you can while riding. Virginia has passed a code section advising that a person in a motor vehicle who wants to pass a bicyclist must do so at a reasonable speed and give at least three feet of clearance.

- If you're riding at night, reflective clothing is a must. Additionally, Virginia State Code dictates that bicyclists riding at night must have AT LEAST one white headlight visible out to 500 feet, and one red reflector on the rear visible out to 600 feet. The bike must also have one red taillight visible at least 500 feet to the rear of the bike. The taillight may either be blinking or solid, and may be attached to either the bike or the rider.
