NEW SCHOOL Proposed in Our School District

The 2004 school bond referendum provided a facelift and some much-needed classroom space to Watkins Elementary. However, the school is still far above its functional capacity.

A new elementary school to relieve overcrowding at Watkins and Weaver elementary schools is the only new school construction project in a \$353 million bond referendum. Chesterfield County residents will be asked to vote on this issue as well as other vital resources in November 2013. Find out from school and county leaders about the 11 school projects, necessary replacement of a nearly obsolete emergency communications 911 system, how the county hopes to pay for the work, and the bond referendum as a whole on Tuesday, September 17, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. at the clubhouse.

Architectural Review Rules

Major additions, such as decks, porches, and patios, require a site visit by the Architectural Review Committee. Residents must stake the perimeter of home additions, patios, decks, porches, sheds, etc. before the site visit. Staking gives the ARC a visual reference for how the addition would affect neighboring properties. Any changes or additions to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval. News from Scotter Hills/Ridgemoor

Corporal Scott Gordon attended the board meeting on July 16, 2013 and discussed safety issues within our community. He is with the Crime Prevention Unit and shared a great deal of information with us.

Removal of yellow paint on the curbs has begun. Absolute Asphalt is sandblasting the yellow paint from our curbs in preparation for the application of new asphalt sealant and fire lane markings. Please do not park adjacent to the curbs and be sure to pull as far up in your driveway as possible in order to avoid overspray or dust debris from the removal process. Vehicles adjacent to the curbing are subject to towing at the owner's expense. All other areas in our community will be open for parking during the time this work is being conducted and towing in those areas will not occur.

Absolute Asphalt has begun resurfacing the streets. Homeowners have received a newsletter outlining with a colored map the areas and which days this will occur. The affected areas will be closed from 7:00 am through 8:00 pm while work is in progress and the surfaces are drying.

Beginning the week of July 29, 2013 all gutters on the townhomes will be inspected and cleaned. On the week of August 2, 2013 Hanover Handy Services will be power-washing the townhomes. Please remove all items from your porches and patios to ensure they are not damaged during this process.

HOA Board Ruling Regarding Rain Barrels

Recently, The Grove HOA Board proposed and approved a modification to the Architectural Standards governing the appearance and placement of rain barrels in residents yards.

Rain barrels must be muted in color, either brown, green, or black, and may not be placed in front or side yards. Rain barrels can be placed in the back yard only, as long as they cannot be seen from the street. If they are visible from the street, rain barrels are permitted only if they have additional screening, at the discretion of the Architectural Review Committee.

Mailbox post and the box itself must be in good appearance. If the post is still in presentable condition, apply a fresh coat of paint, but if deteriorated, replace it. Approved hunter green boxes can be ordered online (not in stores) at www.homedepot.com, item # E1600G00. Two Grove residents provide mailbox repairs,

replacements, and vinyl posts: Dale Murphy (405-1023) and John Romano (379-1238). If your mailbox letters need replacement contact Ray Hite at 434-480-9986. Also, many home repair companies offer mailbox refurbishing services. Make sure any individual or company adheres to bylaw standards.

Most shutters are under a lifetime warranty, so do not repaint or replace! Warranty information should be on the back of the shutters, including shipping requirements for repair/replacement. Contact the company to verify instructions.

Are your doors or garage doors fading? If so, either refresh the existing color or submit an application to the Architectural Review Committee to change the paint color.

Annual letters of violation will be sent to those who have not taken care of these items, so take a proactive stance now!

Much of Virginia has seen flooding already this year, and hurricane season is just beginning. What should you do now to protect your family and property?

Talk to an insurance agent about flood insurance. Just one inch of water in a home or office can mean \$8,000 in cleanup and repairs, and most homeowners' insurance policies do not cover flooding. Remember:

There is usually a 30-day waiting period before coverage begins.

Renters also can buy flood insurance, to cover personal belongings or business inventory.

Download the free Ready Virginia app for iPhone[®] and Android™ devices. Use the app to prepare for disasters and to stay informed during emergencies. Features include:

The latest disaster news on widespread emergencies from the Virginia Department of Emergency Management.

Build an emergency kit. Start with three days' water and three days' food that doesn't need electricity or refrigeration. Then add:

A battery-powered and/or hand-crank radio with a weather band and extra batteries to hear information from local officials.

Flashlights and extra batteries.

First aid kit and extra supply of medications.

Special items for babies, older family members and pets.
