A Piece of Tuscany: By Mitford residents Terry and Mike Mathisen

We are so excited to share our Italy experience with our Grove neighbors. Mike's maternal grandparents (Orfanelli) grew up in Italy and came to America in their late teens. We always wanted to go and our first opportunity was this past summer when we joined other family members for this fantastic 2 week adventure.

One of Mike's cousins decided to organize the trip, and 15 family members were able to go. We both retired recently so time was not an issue. Mike and I are those tourists with gusto, wanting to see it all. Since Mike and I went to Rome ahead of the others, we worked with a travel agency and asked questions of visitors to catch all the "must see" things.

Our trip began with 3 1/2 days in Rome. We saw ancient ruins including the Colosseum, the Forum and the Pantheon. We also visited the Spanish Steps and Trevi Fountain (tossed coins over our shoulder to insure our return). Rome has a lot of fountains. Then we visited Vatican City, and explored the Sistine Chapel and St Peter's Basilica. We experienced Rome by "hop on, hop off" tour buses, taxis and *lots* of walking.

On day 4, we got lost in Italy. We left Rome headed to Sette Bagni to meet Mike's uncle at the train station to drive to Tuscany. A schedule change landed us on a local bus. Our bus left us on the side of the highway with our luggage in tow, having to find the train station. Outside of tourist areas, English is spoken less, and we did not know Italian; but, folks were helpful and we finally made it there. We can look back and laugh about it now!

We stayed for a week in a 7 bedroom villa south of Florence in the Tuscany region, our hub for day trips. Italy is the world's largest wine producer, so one day we took a guided wine tour in the Chianti region. We traveled first to Florence to

experience where the Renaissance began. We visited the Uffizi Gallery and saw all the masters' works, such as Michelangelo, Leonardo and Botticelli. Next we took a high speed train to Venice for the day...what an interesting and unique city of water canals and its impressive San Marco's square. Venice is also famous for its Murano glass, sold in all their stores. Mediterranean cruise ships also dock here. The next several days, we visited unique "hill" towns or "walled cities" like Orvieto, Radda, San Gimignano and Cortona.

We returned to Rome for 2 nights, then headed south by train to Naples for the day. Our tour guide met us at the train station and drove us to the Amalfi Coast (Sorrento and Positano) where we had a delicious lunch on the side of the cliffs overlooking the ocean. Then we stopped at Pompeii to see the ruins caused by the eruption of Mt Vesuvius 2000 years ago. The drive along the coastline was breathtaking from high up on the cliffs. Pompeii was interesting...a city buried by volcanic ash 2000 years ago, and for 300 years they have been excavating and recovering its remains.

The food was fantastic; especially the 2 nights a chef cooked for us at the villa. We also enjoyed the great vino (wine) and gelato (Italian ice cream). I thought Mike was going to turn into a gelato as he could not pass a gelato shop without ordering. The countryside was beautiful; from the huge fields of sunflowers to the picturesque rolling hills. It is mindboggling the history we saw, going back 3000 years vs. 300 years in the US. We hadn't even gotten home before wanting to return.

A few tips: Buy your tour tickets before you go to avoid standing in long lines (called "Skip the Line"). Purchase a tour book (we used Rick Steve's Italy) for maps, tips, tour hours, food suggestions, etc. Rick Steve's also has free Apps to download. We had tours most days, but left a few open for unexpected trips. To "see it all," get in shape due to the amount of walking and climbing...take comfortable shoes. Be relaxed and "go with the flow", so you will enjoy every minute!




