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# 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Sweetheart 8k Race

On Saturday, February 16, 2008, the Grove will once again host the 5<sup>th</sup> annual Sweetheart 8k Race. Last year, approximately 300 runners and walkers and over 30 volunteers participated in this annual event. The 8K (4.96 mile) run begins at 8:30 am and will follow last year's course through several Grove neighborhoods, the North Woolridge tunnel, portions of the Miner's Park Trail and finish near the clubhouse on the walking path around the pond.

Runners will be asked to park their vehicles in designated areas to avoid blocking driveways. Local police will assist with traffic control. The middle section of Grove Hill Road will be closed from approximately 7:30-10:30 am on race day.



Last year, this race received rave reviews from the Grove residents that participated as runners and volunteers as well as from many of the Richmond Road Runner Club members. This event continues to be an excellent opportunity to showcase our beautiful community and neighborhoods.


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
