Project Lifesaver Rescues Special Needs Individuals

In October 2011, autistic, eight year old child Robert Wood, Jr., disappeared in the Hanover County woods. Remarkably he was found alive, surviving the elements without food and water, and IN SPITE of eluding intensive search efforts by a wide network of professionals and volunteers. His disappearance and attempts to evade rescuers, raises the need to spread the news about Project Lifesaver.

Project Lifesaver provides prompt response to help special needs children and adults in dangerous situations. Individuals who wander due to Alzheimer's, Autism, Down Syndrome, dementia and related disorders benefit from participating in the Project Lifesaver program. Statistics show a 100% success rate tracking those wearing a lifesaver bracelet. The average rescue time is 22 minutes, without serious injuries or death.

To qualify in Chesterfield, participants must reside in the county, with a full time caregiver, and must not have permission to drive a motor vehicle. They also need to wear a personalized radio-operated Project Lifesaver bracelet which emits a tracking signal 24/7. These tracking bracelets can be obtained though the Chesterfield County Police Department and must be returned when the contract has ended. Please contact the department for costs and details.

All Shook UP: The Pros and Cons of Earthquake Insurance

Devastation from the 2011 earthquake has prompted many Central Virginians to consider buying earthquake insurance. Here's what the SCC says about coverage:

"Earthquakes are probably not something most Virginians think about when purchasing homeowners insurance. However, an earthquake on August 23, 2011 in Central Virginia served as a reminder that they can, and do, happen here.

The State Corporation Commission's (SCC) Bureau of Insurance reminds Virginians that damage from earthquakes is excluded under homeowners' policies unless coverage for earthquake-related damage has been purchased as an addition to their homeowners' insurance policy. Not every insurance company offers earthquake coverage, but many of them do. Consumers should review their policies to determine if they want to purchase this added protection.

Virginia Insurance Commissioner Jacqueline K. Cunningham encourages Virginia homeowners to review their policies carefully to fully understand any coverage limitations or exclusions, and to contact their insurance agents or companies for information relating to earthquake coverage and the rates for specific policies. Earthquake insurance rates are determined differently by each insurance company and vary depending upon the home's building construction.

Homeowners should review the coverage provisions and pay particular attention to the way the earthquake deductible applies. Earthquake deductibles are usually expressed as a percentage rather than a flat dollar amount, and many insurance companies use a two percent deductible. Earthquake deductibles apply separately to each coverage under the homeowners policy, so the Bureau urges consumers to make sure they understand how their deductible works.

Consumers who are deaf or who are hearing or speech impaired may call through the SCC's Telecommunications Device for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (TDD) at (804) 371 -9206.

The SCC is located in the Tyler Building at 1300 East Main Street in downtown Richmond. Normal business hours are from 8:15 a.m. to 5 p.m. Correspondence may be mailed to the Bureau of Insurance at P.O. Box 1157, Richmond, VA 23218."

- Guard rail repair/replacement
- Bridge work
- Animal, tree and debris removal from roadway


