Architectural Review Reminders

STOP! Don't add that porch, pergola, or patio, without ARC approval. Per covenants, any "rogue" modifications to your home can be removed at YOUR expense. ADDITIONS, including rooms, landscaping, etc., as well as CHANGES to exterior paint colors, siding, and fixtures, etc., must be approved before work begins. Outdoor fixtures should be replaced with existing makes/models. Storm doors need to be authorized, too. Sellers MUST purchase a NEW disclosure package for the buyer during the contract period. New homeowners have the right to cancel a contract without a current package. Order disclosure packages at www.communitygroup.com, by clicking the "Selling & Refinancing" tab, then the "Place Order Here" tab. If you have any questions or need help, please call Community Group, Owner Services 270-1800.

Sellers of properties in Krim Point, Ridgemoor, and Scotter Hills must purchase a disclosure package from their neighborhood HOA in addition to The Grove disclosure package.


