2010 Election Results

Election: At the Annual HOA meeting held November 11, 2010, Grove homeowners cast over 200 proxy ballots to re-elect the entire Board. While Gerry Mancuso, Steve Judd, and Maria Collins retain their respective roles as President, Vice-President, and Treasurer, Gary Powers now serves as Secretary, and Gary Zyla as Director. It was a close race, with Mancuso leading at 117 votes, Judd 114, Collins 106, Powers 98, and Zyla 96. Former Director Bryan Foutch also ran but did not win, although he captured a respectable 85 votes.

Bylaw Amendment: Proxy ballots submitted to change the current Board term limitations from one to two years are still being counted.

Clubhouse Rental Is Just a Few Clicks Away

Stop growling at your computer! Here's how to reserve the Clubhouse online:

Go to http://thegrovehoa.com/. If you do not already have a user name and password, click on the "Subscribe" link in the News and Alerts section of the webpage. This brings up a form requesting your residence information. Once you submit the form, you'll get a confirmation page. Within 48 hours you should receive an email with the user name and password.



Access the Clubhouse online reservation system directly at http://thegrovehoa.com/clubhouse/clubhouse-rentals. Scroll down the page midway to the calendar section and click on the 31 day icon at the right. The calendar appears at the bottom. You can move forward or back through bookings by using the arrows "Next month", "Next 3 months", "Previous month", and "Previous 3 months". Note: the Clubhouse is booked only once per day.

To reserve a date, click "add new booking," then log in with the user name and password. Click on the + sign to the right of the date you want. This brings you to the "Add a booking page," which defaults to "Clubhouse." Click on the "Add" button to get to the "Add Booking" form. Complete the following fields (those having asterisks are required):

Title of Event Your Full Name* Phone Number* Email Address* Start date and time* End date and time*

Press the save button.

You will get a confirmation email within 48 hours. The date will appear orange until confirmed then it changes to green.

Winter Energy Savings Tips

This winter, save money and stay warm. Keep your energy bill and your pollution output low this winter by taking a whole-house approach to heating.

- During the heating season, keep the draperies and shades on your south facing windows open during the
 day to allow the sunlight to enter your home and closed at night to reduce the chill you may feel from
 cold windows.
- Set your thermostat as low as is comfortable when home. By resetting your programmable thermostat from 72 degrees to 65 degrees for eight hours a day (for instance, while no one is home or while everyone is tucked in bed) you can cut your heating bill by up to 10 percent.
- Weatherize your home: caulk and weatherstrip any doors and windows that leak air.
- Properly maintain and clean heating equipment.
- Replace furnace filters regularly.
- Check the insulation in your attic, ceilings, exterior and basement walls, floors, and crawl spaces to see if it meets the levels recommended for your area.

Holiday Shopping Safety

Holiday season is fast approaching and with that said it is time to remember that criminals don't take a vacation. Here are some tips to help make your shopping experience safer:

- If possible, shop during daylight hours
- Shop with a friend or a group of friends
- Avoid wearing excessive or expensive jewelry
- Choose parking spaces in high traffic, well-lit areas, as close to entrances as possible
- Do not leave valuables visible inside your car
- Always lock your car and make sure windows, including the sunroof, are completely closed
- Stay alert and be aware of those around you
- Do not allow yourself to be distracted, offenders may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or belongings
- Keep your purse closed, carry it close to your body and keep a firm grip on it
- Never leave your purse or wallet unattended in a shopping cart
- Avoid carrying multiple credit cards and large amounts of cash
- Conceal your credit card numbers and personal identification numbers (PIN)
- Do not overburden yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion to avoid mishaps
- Walk facing traffic so you can see approaching cars
- Have keys in your hand as you approach your vehicle
- Check the back seat of your car before entering
- Once you are in your vehicle, lock your doors immediately
- Never place packages or your purse on top of your vehicle
- Immediately report suspicious persons and activities to police



Get Ready Now For Winter!

Winter Preparedness Week is Dec. 5-11, 2010

Who can forget the winter of 2009-2010! Multiple record-breaking snowstorms and cold temperatures affected every part of Virginia.

Millions of us suffered through power outages. Snowplow drivers worked around the clock to get roads open. School systems shut down for days. Sadly, 14 Virginians lost their lives due to last winter's storms.

Many communities set records for the number of days with at least one inch of snow on the ground. And it could happen again this year.

Winter Preparedness Week – set for Dec. 5-11 – is the time to get ready for possible bad weather. All it takes is one heavy snow that sticks around for several days or an ice storm that knocks out power to remind us that being prepared ahead of time just makes sense.

- **Make a plan.** Decide on a meeting place outside of your neighborhood if your family is separated and cannot return home because of closed roads. Choose an out-of-town relative or friend to be your family's point of contact for emergency communications. With your family, write down your emergency plan get a free worksheet at www.ReadyVirginia.gov.
- **Get a kit.** Here are basic supplies for winter weather: three days' food; three days' water (a gallon per person per day); a battery-powered and/or hand-crank radio with extra batteries; and your written family emergency plan. After you have these essential supplies, add a first aid kit, medications if needed, blankets and warm clothing, supplies for special member of your household, and pet items.
- **Stay informed.** Before, during and after a winter storm, you should listen to local media for information and instructions from emergency officials. Be aware of winter storm watches and warnings and road conditions. You can get road condition information 24/7 by calling 511 or checking www.511Virginia.org.

Go to www.ReadyVirginia.gov and print out an emergency supply checklist and a family emergency plan. It's time to get ready for winter weather now.

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
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
