Architectural Review Rules

Before installing those outdoor patios or extending your deck, any changes or additions to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval.

Major additions must be staked for visual reference to assess impact to adjoining properties. Scotter Hills and Ridgemoor residents must apply to their board for approval PRIOR to submitting to The Grove ARC. No applications will be considered without the Scotter Hills/Ridgemoor board consent. The HOA has 30 days to review submissions to ARC. For complete details see www.thegrovehoa.com Covenants & Bylaws tab.

Homeowners whose property backs up to the walking paths should periodically check their shrubbery and trees for overhanging branches inhibiting people's progress on the paths.

Winter Preparedness

As the leaves begin to fall and the temperatures begin to drop, it is time to prepare your home for the upcoming changes that are upon us.

It is an opportunity to not only change the clocks, but also change batteries. If you have not done this already, cleaning and replacing the batteries in smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are keys to keeping such equipment functional. However, instead of throwing out the batteries, which may still hold some charge, use the old batteries

for children's toys or electronic devices to get their full use before you drop them off to be recycled.

Check your light bulbs. There is less natural lighting available during the winter months, so making sure all your bulbs are operating at an optimal level is important to the safety of your family and your home.

Prepare for the cold and flu season that is on the horizon. With cold weather comes the potential for illness, so take a minute to make sure your medicine cabinets contain items that will help get you through a typical winter illness. and flu germs! No one wants their kids to get "cooties". Keep healthy, and avoid spreading germs, with a few simple actions.

Wash hands! Use the 20 second rule. Rub hands with soap and water for 20 seconds (roughly the count of the ABC song or Happy Birthday twice). Teach your kids to wash their hands

when hands are dirty, before they eat or touch food, after they use the bathroom, after they cough into their hands or blow You know, it's nice to share, but not when you share your cold their nose, after they leave the playground, and before and after they spend time with someone who's sick.

> Use hand sanitizer. It's your child's first defense against germs, especially if they cannot get to a sink to wash their hands. (continued on page 10)

Butternut Squash Soup

This golden soup soothes and comforts after a busy day. Many grocery stores now sell the squash already peeled and cubed, so preparation is even easier.

Nutrition Facts

Calories 64 per serving Protein 2g per serving Fiber 2g per serving Servings 6 Serving Size 1 cup

Ingredients

2 teaspoons canola or corn oil

- 2 medium shallots (chopped)
- 1 medium butternut squash, peeled and cubed (about 3 cups)
- 3 cups fat-free, low-sodium vegetable broth
- 2 teaspoons minced, peeled gingerroot
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper ((coarsely ground preferred))
- 1/3 cup fat-free half-and-half
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly grated or ground nutmeg

Directions

Heat the oil in the pressure cooker on sauté. Cook the shallots for 3 minutes, or until soft, stirring frequently. Turn off the pressure cooker.

Stir in the squash, broth, gingerroot, salt, and pepper. Secure the lid. Cook on high pressure for 20 minutes. Allow the pressure to release naturally for 10 minutes, then quickly release any remaining pressure. Turn off the pressure cooker. Remove the pressure cooker lid.

Allow the soup to cool slightly. Working in batches, transfer the soup to a blender (vent the blender lid) and puree until smooth. (Use caution as the soup and steam are hot and vent the blender lid away from you.) Return the soup to the pressure cooker.

Stir in the half-and-half. Cook on the sauté setting for 2 to 3 minutes, or until heated through, stirring frequently. Ladle the soup into bowls. Sprinkle with the nutmeg.

Top this soup with other garnishes, such as toasted pumpkin seeds or peeled, diced apple.

A 60 percent alcohol base is recommended but only if your child is old enough to use sanitizer on their hands not in their mouth or any other body parts due to poisoning concerns.

Cough into the curve of an elbow. This keeps germs off hands to prevent spreading illness by direct contact and through respiratory droplets in the air.

Use a tissue to help contain airborne germs.

Do not share straws, cups, food, forks or spoons.

Establish healthy habits. Teach your kids to eat right, exercise, take vitamins, and get enough sleep. "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!"

Make or review your family emergency plan so you and your family will be prepared in the event of inclement weather or sudden storms that may arise and disrupt your daily routine. Update emergency phone numbers or contact information, and make sure your children know what they are supposed to do in case of early school closings or other events that may occur.

Another important thing to remember with the time change is that children may be getting on or getting off of the bus in the dark. Watch for children walking to and from bus stops. Also, remind children which side of the road they should walk on to be seen by oncoming traffic. If feasible, have your child carry some sort of light they can use to be seen by oncoming vehicles. Fire Safety

The Grove is a non-leaf burning neighborhood. Please do not burn your trash, debris, or anything else in your yard. Also please observe the following on fire pits/chimineas:

Recreational and Warming fires are allowed without a permit if the fuel is clean wood **ONLY** and shall be at least 25 feet from any structure or combustible material and be no larger than 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height. Do not place a fire pit/ chimineas on your deck or less than 25 feet from your house.
