Grove Election 2024 Results

On June 13, 2024, the HOA held its Annual Meeting and Election of Board members. Up for consideration were two seats on the Board. Per HOA by-laws, 25% or 184 of the 736 homes in The Grove needed to return proxies in order to meet quorum and thus hold the election. We received 311 proxies. *Results:* Both Eric Drum and Amy Vincent were re-elected to serve on the HOA Board. Amy Vincent remains as Vice President. Eric Drum becomes the President, and Matt Chafin is now our Treasurer. Jay Scheer continues as Secretary and Phillip Greer as Director. Congratulations, everyone!!!

Election Season Reminders from The Grove Board

"We are writing to remind everyone that political signs and flags are not permitted in The Grove neighborhood. This includes signs supporting candidates, political parties, or ballot measures for any national, state, or local election. See design standard sections 2.5.2 and 2.5.3 for more details. This policy is in place to maintain the aesthetic appeal of our community and prevent disputes or conflicts among neighbors. We understand that elections are important, but we ask that you express your political views in other ways. **Thank you for keeping The Grove a welcoming and visually pleasing place for all residents.**"

ISO: A NEW COMMUNITY MANAGEMENT GROUP

At the Annual HOA meeting, we discussed the growing dissatisfaction with Associa Community Group. The Board had recently become aware of disturbing financial errors on our books. This, in conjunction with months of the management group's unresponsiveness to issues such as ARC requests and resale inspections, has prompted the Board to move on, and seek a replacement. I reached out to the Board for a status on the situation, and they assured me that getting a solution is top priority. They will share when they have something more definitive on prospective new management companies. For now, Jo Mendoza is still our manager at Community Group. The Board is working with Community Group to make the best of things until a new company is selected.

HOA Connection

Architectural Review Rules: Any modifications to your home or landscaping need prior ARC approval. Major additions must be staked for visual reference to assess impact to adjoining properties. Scotter Hills and Ridgemoor residents must apply ONLY to The Grove ARC. The HOA has 30 days to review submissions to ARC. For details see www.thegrovehoa.com Covenants & Bylaws tab. Homeowners whose property backs up to the walking paths should check their shrubbery and trees for overhanging branches inhibiting people's progress on the paths. Trim bushes or trees that obstruct visibility of stop or street signs.

COMMUNITY GROUP NORMAL BUSINESS & AFTER HOURS COVERAGE

To report urgent or life threatening issues after normal business hours (after 5 pm and before 9:00 am), please contact Community Group, 804-270-1800 and follow the prompts for the 24 hour On Call Manager. Please DO NOT call Board members or leave messages on the regular Community Group inbox – those calls are not returned until the following business day. The On Call Manager can handle any urgent request immediately. Home Sales in The Grove Require Disclosure Packages

Residents selling their home must purchase an updated disclosure book from the HOA to give to their buyer (for the Grove book contact Community Group 804-270-1800, Krim Point and Scotter Hills/Ridgemoor request those additional books from your HOA). Your buyer has 3 days to review the documents once in hand. The Virginia Statutes allows up to 14 calendar days for processing the disclosure book request. If a book is needed sooner, an additional rush fee of \$70.66 is required. The rush timeframe takes 3-5 business days. The emailed disclosure package costs \$317.95, or a hardcover package costs \$347.29. These books do include an inspection report to the exterior of the home to ensure that architectural guidelines set in place by the association are in compliance. In addition, there is a post-closing fee of \$70.66 that is charged at every sale to the buyer. It is an administrative fee to remove the previous owner from the address account and set up the new buyer account. Any major additions to the exterior of your home or landscaping should have been approved by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC). Failure to do so may hold up closing if the buyer balks at violations/non-compliance issues. Call Community Group to make sure any additions, such as a fence, shed, patio, swing set, satellite dish, etc. made by the previous owner of your home was approved by ARC.

2.5 LANDSCAPE ACCESSORIES

2.5.1 MAILBOXES: (See Illustration 2.5.1 in Appendix A) Mailboxes must be installed utilizing the standard

The Grove post and the approved size box. Boxes shall be metal with Rust-Oleum Dark Hunter Green gloss finish. Specified wood posts shall be painted with gloss white paint. Numbers shall be raised and painted gloss Dark Hunter Green to match box. Mailbox post and the paper box may be white vinyl PVC. Grove post dimensions 5 to 6 feet tall, 4 inches wide. Sides of paper box are ¾ thick, 7 ¼ inches from top to bottom, top of the side is 23 inches long and the bottom is 21 inches long. Mailbox flags should be Krylon Colormaxx gloss BANNER RED. (Amended 10/21)

To report a downed or damaged street name sign, please call 804-751-4627, or email napiert@chesterfield.gov. If at all possible please report: the names of both streets at the intersection affected by the damaged or downed street sign, and the regulatory or warning sign on the same pole (if applicable).

To report a downed or damaged regulatory, warning or guide signs contact the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) by calling 800-367-7623. Call VDOT for street light repair.

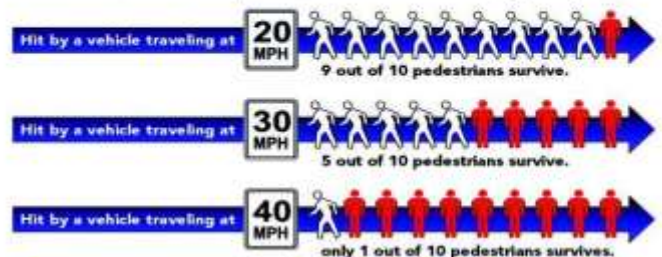


TAKE PICS FOR ARC SUBMISSIONS!

Photos and/or drawings should accompany any exterior modification requests to the ARC. This prevents unnecessary delays in processing your application for any projects. For tree removals and replacement, the ARC needs a photo of the tree to be removed. If you are submitting a landscaping plan, please include a rendering of the plan, as well as pictures or a list of the new plant material that you want to install. The rendering can be done either by you, or by the landscaping company you are using.

What To Do (And Not Do) During A Flood

“Turn around, don’t drown!”

While tornadoes and hurricanes are scary and destructive, when it comes to one of the most dangerous weather events, floods are devastating. It’s not just billions in property damage; it is the loss of lives!

Eight out of ten floods happen AWAY from the coastline.

Keep calm and be prepared. Use these simple guidelines to keep you and your loved ones safer (and drier) in a flood.

Be Alert to flash flood watches and warnings:

Flash floods happen quickly at ANY TIME OR SEASON as a result of a heavy downpour, storm surge, coastal storm, snow, or overflow from a local dam or other waterway. They can quickly become life-threatening, so **SUBSCRIBE AND BE ALERT** to information from the National Weather Service about your area.

At Home, Office, or School:

With a flood warning, move to a safer location, or stay put if you're already on high ground. If a flood warning turns into a flood emergency, flooding has reached a point where it can cause catastrophic damage. In that situation, you should not travel if you're in a safe, high-ground location **UNLESS** your area is being ordered to evacuate.

If you are in a car:

Immediately get to a safer location, which usually means higher ground. If the Emergency Alert System (EAS) is telling your area to evacuate, follow their instructions on where to go and how to get there.

DO NOT drive around barricades. Responders use these to keep people out of flood-prone areas.

Stay off bridges over water — rising water can take out bridges without warning. **DO NOT DRIVE** through high water even if you

think you can make it through. Those SUVs and Trucks you see in this picture **CAN GET STUCK!** Your Mini Cooper won’t make it either! Just one foot of water is enough to lift a car off the ground. But if your vehicle gets stuck in moving water, stay inside. If water starts to rise inside, then get out onto the roof.

ON FOOT:

DO NOT try to wade through water. Six inches of water will knock you over, especially if it’s moving quickly.

Floodwaters can electrify you by downed power lines! These fast moving waters also have dangerous, life threatening debris.

Seek shelter inside on a higher floor. Make sure your exit route is clear – don't get trapped in an attic with no windows, for example.

If the water looks to engulf the house/property, get on the roof and signal for help.

Some final dos and don'ts:

DON'T use electricity in a home that's flooded or leave it on if you're evacuating.

If water touches live electrical outlets, you could be electrocuted, or it could cause a devastating fire.

DON'T handle wild animals in the floodwaters.

They may have disease, or become aggressive in an unfamiliar environment.

DO make sure you have a weather emergency kit packed and ready to go ahead of time.

Essentials **ONLY!** Medicines, Food, Water, Clothing, First Aid, Blankets, etc. Charge all cell phones and bring chargers.

Plot your evacuation route ahead of time.

But watch for changes in the storm’s track/path.

DON'T leave valuables or irreplaceable furniture on the lower levels of your house IF SAFE TO DO!:

Bring them upstairs **TO PREPARE FOR A STORM ONLY IF YOU HAVE TIME AND THE STRENGTH TO MOVE THEM.**

Protect Your Body!:

Wear protective clothing if you need to brave the flood at all. Waders or tall rubber rain boots are great if you have them. And if you have to move any debris, make sure you're wearing gloves.



Grilled Salmon with Mango & Tomato Salsa



Mango with fresh cilantro adds a tropical zing to any salsa! Grill your salmon with the skin on, and oil your grill grates to prevent sticking. You can also cook the salmon in the oven at 425 degrees in a shallow baking pan for about 10 minutes or until cooked through. We have also tried this recipe with cod and it is quite delish! Serves 6 at 220 calories each. Protein 23 grams. Prep time 15 minutes. Cook time 15 minutes.

- Chili powder 1 tbsp.
- Cumin, 1 tbsp.
- Garlic powder, 1/4 tsp.
- Ground cinnamon, 1/4 tsp.
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Salmon, 1.5 lbs., cut into 6 equal portions
- Canola oil, 1 tbsp.
- Diced mango, 1.5 cups
- Diced tomato, 1.5 cups
- Lemon, 1, juiced and divided
- Chopped fresh cilantro, 1/2 cup

Preheat the grill to medium high heat. In a small bowl, combine chili powder, cumin, garlic powder, cinnamon, and salt. Sprinkle the spice mixture evenly over the salmon fillets. Lightly oil the grill grates with the canola oil. Place the salmon on the grill, skin side down. Cook uncovered for 7 to 8 minutes, turning halfway through. The salmon is done when it flakes easily with a fork.

While salmon is cooking, combine mango, tomatoes, cilantro, and half of the lemon juice in a medium bowl. Remove salmon from grill and spritz with remaining lemon juice.

Serve each fillet with 1/2 cup salsa.

Take Care of Those Chompers!

Healthy living promotes healthy teeth and gums, so think before you eat and drink. It's not just what you eat but when you eat that impacts dental health. Eat a balanced diet and limit between-meal snacks. If you are on a special diet, pick foods per your physician's advice. Follow these tips when choosing your meals and snacks:

- Drink plenty of water.
- Eat a variety of foods from each of the five major food groups, including:
 - 1) whole grains
 - 2) fruits
 - 3) vegetables
 - 4) lean sources of protein such as lean beef, skinless poultry and fish; dry beans, peas and other legumes
 - 5) low-fat and fat-free dairy foods

Limit the number of snacks you eat. If you do snack, select fruit or vegetables or a piece of cheese. Foods that are eaten as part of a meal cause less harm to teeth than eating lots of snacks throughout the day, because more saliva is released during a meal. Saliva helps wash foods from the mouth and lessens the effects of acids, which can harm teeth and cause cavities. For good dental health, always remember to brush twice a day with fluoride toothpaste that has the ADA Seal of Acceptance, floss daily and visit your dentist regularly. With proper dental care, your dentist can help prevent oral problems from occurring in the first place, and catch those that do occur in the early stages, while they are easy to treat.
